In Part one of the 3 part series (***iDevices: The Newest Technology on the Block***), you will learn about the newest technology for learning. In this webinar, we will share what they look like, how to change settings to support accessibility, and how to perform basic maintenance tasks. In Part two of the series (***Apps for This and That***), an app evaluation tool will be shared to help keep track of all of those apps viewed. A discussion of current app review sites along with proven apps will be discussed to support life skill development, communication, productivity, brainstorming, organization and time monitoring apps. Finally in Part 3 of the series (***Sliding, Gliding and Tapping***), learn about ways to develop independent access of iDevices through games.

1. Participants will connect the principles of the SETT framework, Universal Design, and the universality of assistive technology tools and strategies into their decision making process for the selection of iDevices and apps to support inclusion in therapy settings, the home, and in the community.
2. Participants will describe the accessibility features available in the iDevices.
3. Participants will be able to identify the basic maintenance functions to keep iDevices working properly.

Session 2: March 15, 2012 3:00 to 4:00 pm EST

Participant learning outcomes:

1. Participants will discuss an app rubric to assist with feature matching and app evaluation to support to support inclusion in therapy settings, the home, and in the community.
2. Participants will assess review sites for app evaluation using the SETT framework.
3. Participants will compare apps in the categories of communication, life skills, organization, monitoring time, brainstorming and productivity to support inclusion in therapy settings, the home, and in the community.

Session 3: April 5, 2012 3:00- 4:00 pm EST

Participant learning outcomes:

1. Participants will identify the skills needed to use iDevices independently to use in therapy settings, the home, and in the community.
2. Participants will develop an understanding of the skills employed in iDevice gaming to support iDevice access development.
3. Participants will review and develop a plan monitoring progress in iDevice access skill development to support inclusion in therapy settings, the home, and in the community.
